

Know Egypt

- Area 1 001 450 km²
- Capital Cairo
- Population estimated 80 000 000
- Costs on two seas
- Country in two continent (Africa, Asia)

Know Cairo

- The largest city in Africa
- One of the most populated cities in the world
- Temperatures

Can reach 45°C in summer, 7°C in winter

- The national currency is the Egyptian Pound (EGP)
- One Egyptian Pound (EGP) = 100 Piaster's (PT)
- Exchange Rate*

1 USD = 5.94584 EGP

1 EUR = 8.50408 EGP







- The main language is Arabic
- English is widely understood



Getting Around

- Cairo is generally safe
- People are friendly
- Walking around is usually safe all day and night
- Rush hours

7:00 am - 9:00 am

4:00 pm - 7:00 pm

Getting Around Walking Around Streets tend to be crowded Crossing roads might be dangerous

Getting Around

- Walking Around
 - Pavements are often misused

- Taxi
 - Fastest and recommended method
 - Three types exist
 Black and white
 White (new taxi)
 Yellow (Cairo cab)

Getting Around

- Black and white taxi
 - Some are old and damages, don't have meters
 - Negotiate fair before riding

- White taxi
 - New , have meters , AC
 - If driver doesn't turn meter on, ask him to

Getting Around

- Yellow taxi
 - Can be called in
 - Slightly expensive than white taxi, not commonly encountered

- Micro Buses
 - Some drivers are reckless
 - Price range from 0.25 to 2 LE per trip

- Mini Buses
 - Some have poor interiors
 - Price range from 0.25 to 2 LE per trip

- Inter city buses
- Price depend on trip distance

Getting Around


- Metro
 - Tend to get crowded in rush hours
 - Price 1 LE per trip

 - Used for between cities travel (www.egyptrail.gov.eg)







Getting Around

- To conclude
 - Taxi's are the fastest and most recommended method
 - Buses are not recommended
 - Metro is recommended for long trips
 - Leave vehicle if you feel unsafe

Getting Connected

- Cell phones
 - All operators are the same
 - Cost depends on scheme (around 20 PT per min.)
 - International cost is around 2 LE per minute.

Getting Supplies

- General supplies
 - Markets are plentiful
 - You might have to ask for what you want

Getting Supplies

- Fruits and Vegetables
 - You can pick items yourself
 - Items are sold in kilograms

- Super Markets
 - Can get most of the supplies
 - Walk through markets
 - Most commonly encountered is Metro market (www.metro-markets.com)

- Pharmacies
 - Commonly encountered
 - Don't need prescription

- Fast food restaurants
 - Commonly encountered
 - Home delivery is available
 - Phone number found on yellowpages.com.eg, menu found on otlob.com

- Drinking water
 - Tap water is generally safe
 - Preferred to use bottled water
- Food Safety
 - Not all fast food shops are clean
 - Always check the expiration dates
